Incapacity Benefit (IB) Claimant Profiles published in April 2010. These profiles examine the "stock" of IB claimants and the "on" and "off" flow from 2000 to 2008 for fourteen geographies across Scotland. Each profile provides a breakdown of IB claimants by: Sex: Age; Reason for claiming IB (in particular Mental Health claimants); Length of time on IB; Neighbourhood /intermediate zone.




